BEST PRACTICES FOR BUSINESS RECYCLING

Nearly two thirds of the waste created at businesses, churches and non-profits is recyclable. Having a strong recycling program helps your bottom line, conserves natural resources and reduces greenhouse gas emissions to name a few. As business partners, Todd County Solid Waste and your Waste Haulers feel it is important to educate our customers the proper way of using the Recycling Containers.

This guide will help your business be successful with recycling and reducing costs of disposal.

ITEMS ACCEPTED FOR RECYCLING:

Paper: All kinds and colors: mail, envelopes, magazines, catalogs, packing paper, newspaper, inserts, soft cover books, phone books, magazines and catalogs.

Cardboard: unwaxed, broke down

Cartons: Milk, Soy and rice cartons, soup cartons, juice boxes.

Plastics: Pop, juice and beverage bottles, soap and milk jugs.

Glass: Food and beverage bottles and jars.

Metal: Food and beverage cans.

Be sure to train your staff to make sure that everyone knows what *can and cannot be* recycled and to ensure that recyclables and garbage are collected properly in the right dumpsters. Your recycling dumpster should be properly labeled as recycling. Remember, the major cost savings of recycling is in reducing trash disposal costs; therefore, it is important that recycling is diverted from the trash as possible.

We are asking for your help in keeping our recycle containers free from contamination and unwanted material. By doing this will help keep operating cost low, reduces labor, increases safety of our employees, increases the life span of our landfills, and protects our environment.
